

## Measures for protection against the Coronavirus

According to the guidelines of the Federal Office of Public Health (FOPH), 26.10.2021

---

These measures are intended to safeguard the health of our visitors and employees. Their aim is to ensure that the necessary social distancing is maintained, and that hygiene measures are implemented. The situation is being monitored constantly, and these measures will be adapted accordingly, if needed.

Currently the covid-19-regulation is in force by the government. All visitors (above the age of 12) need to wear masks in all indoor public spaces.

### 1. Certificate requirement

- Entrance to the museum is only possible with the Covid Certificate. We therefore ask you to present your certificate and your identity card at the entrance. Admission to the museum for persons over 16 years of age is only possible with a valid Covid Certificate.
- In the work and education places no certificate is required from the government. Employees in the workplace with certificate requirement for example museums need themselves no certificate.
- The following applies within a school group: When attending workshops during opening hours, pupils aged 16 and over as well as teachers and accompanying persons must present a certificate. Schoolchildren younger than 16 years are exempt from the certificate and mask requirement.
- When attending school outside of the opening times, there is no certificate requirement, the protective measures of the school in question apply.

### 2. Mask requirement

- With the introduction of the Covid Certificate the mask requirement in official open inner rooms is not required. Visitors need to wear a mask, in the entrance and ticket office until they officially show their Covid Certificate. The mask needs to be worn in the museums shop and entrance of the Kunsthaus Zug.
- There is no mask requirement for children and adolescents from 12 to 16 years of age.
- Employees without a 3G certificate who move around the museum area continue to wear the mask.
- As of October 1st, employees can voluntarily submit a certificate in order to be exempt from the mask requirement. Unvaccinated employees who work behind plexiglass are exempt from the mask requirement as long as the plexiglass protection is in place.

### **3. Hand hygiene**

- Disinfectant is available for you at the entrance to the Museum, at the ticket office and at the cloakroom.
- Soap, disposable paper towels and disinfectant are provided in the toilets.
- Payment should preferably be made by card, not cash. If it is not possible for you to pay by card, the exact amount may be placed in the repository provided.
- The doors to the cloakroom behind the reception will remain open.

### **4. Keep your distance**

- Due to the compulsory certificate, the requirements for maintaining the distance for visitors do not apply. However, it is advisable to take this into account whenever possible. For employees without a certificate requirement, the requirement continues to apply (for example in offices etc.)
- There is a plexiglass screen at the ticket office between the visitors and the reception personnel. Please keep your distance from others in the reception area, as indicated by the markings on the floor.
- The restrictions in relation to visitor numbers have been lifted. The full capacity of the museum can be used.
- The spiral staircases between the floors may be used by only one person in one direction at any time, in order to ensure the necessary minimum distance between visitors. The person ascending has right of way.
- The Kunsthaus has ensured that the workspaces of employees in the offices in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> upper floors are 1.5 metres from each other. At the workplaces in the office masks are no longer mandatory; the protection of not vaccinated people is their own responsibility.
- The 1.5 meter distance between the workplaces of the employees in the office rooms on the 1st and 2nd floor is ensured. Masks are no longer required at the workplaces in the offices; People who have not been vaccinated are responsible for protecting themselves.
- Employees who work in the museum area continue to wear masks. From October, employees can exempt themselves from the mask requirement by voluntarily presenting the certificate.

## **5. Cleaning**

- Surfaces that are often touched are regularly disinfected by the cleaning personnel, including lift buttons, door handles, staircase railings, office materials, telephones, computer keyboards and payment machines.
- The employees in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor entering through the 1<sup>st</sup> floor must clean their hands using the sink next to the entrance or disinfect them before entering.
- Office spaces are aired more regularly in order to ensure appropriate ventilation.

## **6. People with COVID-19 at the workplace**

- Sick people must remain at home and are urged to self-isolate according to the instructions issued by the Federal Office of Public Health.
- Those people who only have mild symptoms of COVID-19 should also contact their doctor about being tested and personally inform their personnel manager.

## **7. Special work situations**

- Wearing surgical gloves/face masks is only recommended in situations where employees are unable to maintain the necessary social distancing. This might be the case if several people are needed to engage with a specific object. In these cases, masks and gloves will be provided by the Kunsthaus.

## **8. Information**

- The personnel will be informed regularly:
  - About all measures that the Kunsthaus Zug has introduced. This is in order for personnel to implement these measures, and to ensure that the public also adheres to them.
  - About the continuing code of conduct of the FOPH: Wash your hands or clean them with disinfectant (especially after arriving at your workplace, after contact with the public and after breaktimes); sneeze or cough into a handkerchief or your elbow, and throw away used handkerchiefs.
- The public will be informed:
  - In advance (via the Internet) and on the spot about the measures undertaken and about expected modes of behaviour.
  - That the supervisory staff is authorised to intervene in cases of hazardous behaviour.
- The official communications of the FOPH are displayed in the reception area, the cloakroom, and the toilets.

## 9. Art mediation

- the restriction on the number of visitors to events for art education has been lifted.  
The full capacity of the museum can be used.
